



Port of Barbados Taps Axxess to Supply Security Systems for the Cricket World Cup 2007

Amphion Innovations announced that its Partner Company, Axxess International, a company in which it has a 9 percent ownership, has won a \$2 million contract from the Port of Bridgetown in Barbados to install an integrated radio frequency identification (RFID) and sensor system being deployed to enhance security measures for the Cricket World Cup 2007.

The security system includes Axxess' ActiveTag technology and infrastructure; wireless sensors; and underwater cameras that work in concert to detect and manage security threats.

The system is currently being installed and is expected to be completed in phases over the first half of 2007.
